A white Christmas was n prospect for Albuquerque today as the first Yule-tide snowfall of any consequence in 26 years laid a blanket more than two inches deep over the city, according to the Weather Bureau records.

Warmer but slightly cloudy weather is forecast here for Christmas Day.

The snow, expected to let up before dusk, will leave city streets ley and many state highways glazed and dangerous as a predicted freeze hits onight.
